*Exhibitors may enter two exhibits for each class apart from the
Photography Section: **one photo per exhibitor for each class***

COOKERY SECTION: 14 CLASSES

Section rules:

- All jams, jellies, marmalades and chutneys must have been made by the exhibitor since September 2018
- Each must be displayed in a screw top jar, min. jar size 227g

1. Jar of soft fruit jam
2. Jar of stoned fruit jam
3. Jar of any fruit jelly
4. Jar of marmalade (any type)
5. Jar of chutney (any type)
6. Home-made alcoholic drink (e.g. Sloe Gin, Blackberry Vodka, etc.)
7. Loaf of tea bread
8. Ladies' only Victoria sponge (3 eggs, any jam or lemon curd, caster sugar on top)
9. Flapjack
10. 4 cheese scones (with or without dried fruit)
11. 4 biscuits (any type)
12. 4 shortbreads
13. Men only cake (no help!) Please write on a card the type of cake entered
14. 3 hens' eggs (all same size & colour, one to be broken on a china saucer)

Judging: The judges will be tasting as well as looking and checking if the exhibits are sufficiently cooked. For Class 14 they will check the yolk and the freshness.

FLOWERS SECTION: 6 CLASSES

Section rules:

- All flowers exhibited must be home grown, except for classes 27, 28, 29 and 30, for which flowers etc. may be bought
- Exhibitors to provide their own containers
- All exhibited pot plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least 3 months prior to the Show

15. 1 single rose
16. 4 stems of roses (any variety)
17. 4 stems of any annuals
18. 6 stems of any different flowers (perennials or annuals)
19. 2 sprays of fuchsias
20. 3 cactus dahlias
21. 3 pompon dahlias (maximum size 5cm/2in across)
22. 3 ball dahlias
23. 3 decorative dahlias, includes single daisy types
24. 2 gladioli
25. 3 sprays of chrysanthemums
26. A flowering or foliage house plant
27. Miniature flower arrangement (max. size 10cm/4in)
28. An arrangement floating in water
29. Flower arrangement with 5 single flowers and any foliage

30. Foliage arrangement (can use berries, seed heads etc but no flowers, max. width 36cm/14in)

Judging: Judges will be looking at the form, freshness and condition of the flowers and leaves, size and colour, in that order of priority

VEGETABLES SECTION: 20 CLASSES

Section rules:

- All exhibited vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor and displayed on plates or in shallow bowls or baskets as appropriate

31. Oddest shaped vegetable (can be any un-doctored vegetable)
32. 3 carrots (trim tops to 75mm/3in)
33. 4 white potatoes
34. 4 coloured potatoes
35. 3 onions (white or red)
36. 5 shallots
37. 3 beetroots (trim tops to 75mm/3in)
38. Longest marrow
39. 3 courgettes (same colour)
40. 2 leeks
41. Longest runner bean
42. 5 runner beans
43. 2 heads of sweet corn
44. A selection of vegetables for a cook
45. 6 cherry tomatoes (calyx to be attached and tomato size under 35mm)
46. 4 tomatoes (can be large, medium or plum with calyx attached)
47. 1 cucumber
48. 3 vegetables that can be used in a salad either raw or cooked
49. Any other vegetable not in above list (e.g. pumpkin, gourd, squash, etc.)
50. My best vegetable and my best flower (one only of each)

Judging: Judges will be looking for good condition, uniformity where more than 1 vegetable is displayed, size, shape and colour, in that order of priority

FRUIT SECTION: 8 CLASSES

Section rules:

- All fruit must have been grown by the exhibitor and displayed on plates or in bowls as appropriate

51. 5 plums (any variety)
52. 8 raspberries (calyx to be attached)
53. 8 blackberries (calyx to be attached)
54. 4 eating apples
55. 4 cooking apples
56. 3 pears
57. A bowl of any type of fruit not listed above (e.g. figs, peaches. etc).
58. A display of different home grown fruit in appropriate container

Judging: Judges will be looking for good condition, uniformity, size, shape and colour, in that order of priority

ART SECTION: 5 CLASSES

Section rules:

- Amateurs only for this Section
- For coloured pictures, any medium may be used

59. A design for a kitchen wall tile
60. A picture of a child
61. A titled abstract painting

CRAFTS SECTION: 12 CLASSES

Section rules

- Class 74 amateurs only
