SHOW SECTIONS AND LIST OF CLASSES

Exhibitors may enter two exhibits for each class apart from the Photography Section - one photo per exhibitor for each class

COOKERY SECTION – 17 CLASSES

Section rules:

- All jams, jellies, marmalades and chutneys must have been made by the exhibitor since September 2019
- Each must be displayed in a screw top jar, minimum jar size 227g

1. Jar of soft fruit jam
2. Jar of stoned fruit jam
3. Jar of any fruit jelly
4. Jar of marmalade (any type)
5. Jar of chutney (any type)
6. Home-made alcoholic spirit drink (e.g. Sloe Gin, Blackberry Vodka, etc.)
7. Home-made wine
8. Loaf of tea bread
9. Lemon drizzle cake
10. Four decorated cup cakes
11. Ladies' only Victoria sponge (3 eggs, any jam or lemon curd, caster sugar on top)
12. Flapjack
13. Four cheese scones (with or without dried fruit)
14. Four biscuits (any type)
15. Four shortbreads
16. Men's only cake (no help!) Please write on a card the type of cake entered
17. Three hen's eggs (all same size and colour, one to be broken on a **china** saucer)

***Judging:** The judges will be tasting as well as looking and checking if the exhibits are sufficiently cooked. For Class 17 they will check the yolk and the freshness.*

FLOWERS SECTION – 16 CLASSES

Section rules:

- All flowers exhibited must be home grown, except for Classes 31, 32 and 33, for which flowers etc. may be bought
- Exhibitors to provide their own containers.
- All exhibited pot plants must have been in the exhibitor's possession for at least three months prior to the Show

18. Single rose
19. Four stems of roses (any variety)
20. Spray of clustered flowered roses
21. Four stems of any annuals
22. Six stems of any different flowers (perennials or annuals)
23. Two sprays of fuchsias
24. Three cactus dahlias
25. Three pompon dahlias (max size 5cm/2in across)

26. Three ball dahlias
27. Three decorative dahlias – includes single daisy types
28. Flowering or foliage house plant
29. Three sprays of flowering shrub (**not roses**)
30. Miniature flower arrangement (max size 10cm/4in)
31. An arrangement floating in water
32. Flower arrangement with five single blooms and any foliage
33. Foliage arrangement (can use berries, seed heads etc, but no flowers
– max width 36cm/14in)

Judging: *Judges will be looking at the form, freshness and condition of the flowers and leaves, size and colour, in that order of priority*

VEGETABLES SECTION – 20 CLASSES

Section rules:

- **All exhibited vegetables must be grown by the exhibitor and displayed on plates, shallow bowls or baskets as appropriate**

34. Oddest shaped vegetable (can be any undoctored vegetable)
35. Three carrots (trim tops to 75mm/3in)
36. Four white potatoes
37. Four coloured potatoes
38. Three onions (white or red)
39. Five shallots
40. Three beetroots (trim tops to 75mm/3in)
41. Longest marrow
42. Three courgettes (same colour)
43. Two leeks
44. Longest runner bean
45. Five runner beans
46. Collection of herbs
47. Selection of vegetables for a cook
48. Six cherry tomatoes (calyx to be attached and tomato size under 35mm)
49. Four tomatoes (can be large, medium or plum with calyx attached)
50. Cucumber
51. Three vegetables that can be used in a salad either raw or cooked
52. Any other single vegetable not in above list (e.g. pumpkin, gourd, squash. etc.)
53. My best vegetable and my best flower (one only of each)

Judging: *Judges will be looking for good condition, uniformity where more than one vegetable is displayed, size, shape and colour, in that order of priority*

FRUIT SECTION – 8 CLASSES

Section rules:

- **All fruit must have been grown by the exhibitor**

54. Five plums (any variety)
55. Eight raspberries (calyx to be attached)
56. Eight blackberries (calyx to be attached)

57. Four eating apples
58. Four cooking apples
59. Three pears
60. A bowl of any type of fruit not listed above (e.g. figs, peaches, etc.)
61. A display of different home-grown fruit in appropriate container

Judging: Judges will be looking for good condition, uniformity, size, shape and colour, in that order of priority

ART SECTION – 5 CLASSES

Amateurs only for this section

For coloured pictures, any medium may be used

62. A painted pebble
63. Advertisement for Deddington Farmers' Market
64. Woodland

CRAFTS SECTION – 13 CLASSES

AGE GROUP 5 YEARS and UNDER

AGE GROUP 9–11 YEARS
